INSTITUTE IN SPIRITUALITY

SCHEDULED AT USD JUNE 13-17

"Life in Abundance," an Institute in Spirituality will be held at the University of San Diego in two sessions from 9:00 a.m. to noon and from 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m., June 13 through June 17 in Camino 131.

Tuition for the Institute sponsored by USD's Continuing Education is \$100 for a single session or \$160 for both sessions. Three units of continuing education credit are available. For information call 293-4585.

"Biblical Perspectives in Spirituality," held in the morning session from 9:00 a.m. until noon, will be led by Michael D. Guinan, O.F.M., S.T.L., Ph.D. "Theological Perspectives in Spirituality," held from 1:00 through 4:00 p.m. will be led by Francis Baur, O.F.M., Ph.D. The two components build on each and mutually interact, although each session has its own integrity and can be taken separately.

Fr. Guinan is a professor at the Franciscan School of Theology, Graduate Theological Union, Berkeley, where he teaches Semitic languages, theology of the Old Testament, Wisdom Literature, the Prophets and Contemporary Spirituality.

Fr. Baur is professor of philosophical theology at Graduate Theological Union and the Franciscan School of Theology, Berkeley.

The course in spirituality will analyze and synthesize contemporary understanding of Christian spirituality, its basic elements, and various dynamisms from both biblical and theological perspectives.
