PUBLIC INVITED TO PERUVIAN BANQUET HOSTED BY USD PROGRAM

USD's People-to-People program has announced a Peruvian banquet and special display of Peruvian arts and crafts, to be held Wednesday, October 26 beginning at 7 p.m. at the El Chalan Peruvian Restaurant in La Jolla.

According to Dr. Delwin Schneider, professor of religious studies and founder of the program, the evening's festivities will include an authentic Peruvian dinner served buffet style with a complete selection from the El Chalan menu and a program emceed by KFMB's Mark Larson. Tickets are available at \$15 each, and entitle the guest to participate in a drawing for one of the Peruvian objects assembled for the evening's auction. Reservations may be made by contacting Dr. Schneider at the University, 291-6480, extension 4405.

The People-to-People program, an activity of the USD Religious Studies Club, was launched in 1981. Under its aegis, small teams of students, accompanied by a faculty member, visit remote areas of other countries. Students are required to earn their airfare and other expenses, and the banquet and auction proceeds will become the major part of a fund students earn through bake sales and other campus activities. According to Dr. Gary Macy, USD professor who has accompanied the teams to Chulucanas, Peru for the past two summers, the purpose of the program is "not to instruct the people with whom we come in contact, but to learn from them about life outside the United States and to bring that knowledge back to this country."
