### WHEN SHOULD A LAWYER BLOW THE WHISTLE ON HIS CLIENT?

When should a lawyer blow the whistle on his client? That question, and others pertaining to a lawyer's ethical responsibilities to clients who reveal additional wrongful conduct to them, will be explored by three distinguished law professors at a forum Friday, April 6.

"The Lawyer's Obligation Regarding Client Confidences" will be addressed by David Lubin, professor, University of Maryland Center of Philosophy and Public Policy; Louis Schwartz, professor, Hastings College of Law (University of San Francisco); and John Kelleher, professor, USD School of Law. *UNIVERSITY OF SAN FRANCISCO*

"Basically a lawyer is permitted to reveal intended wrongdoing by clients only when serious bodily injury or death is likely," USD Law Professor Larry Alexander said.

The forum will take place in the Ed and Mary Fletcher Lecture Center, USD School of Law, beginning at 12:15 p.m. Law students, lawyers and the general public are encouraged to attend.
