CARTOONIST PAUL CONRAD

SPEAKS AT USD APRIL 30

Editorial cartoonist Paul Conrad, a three-time Pulitzer Prize winner, is scheduled to speak at 8 p.m. Tuesday, April 30, at USD's Camino Theatre on "The Madness of Politics."

Admission is free to the talk and the reception immediately following.

Conrad, chief editorial cartoonist for the Los Angeles Times since 1964, is syndicated by the Times, appearing in hundreds of newspapers nationwide.

Only three others have won the Pulitzer as many times as Conrad has. His latest Pulitzer was for a body of work dealing with government and military affairs, covert intelligence and the nuclear arms race.

As a lecturer, Conrad does much of what he does in his cartoons. He deflates the pompous and spotlights the explosive political issues of the day. Through an audio-visual presentation of his cartoons, he exposes the occasional chicanery, madness and stupidity of the powerful.
