USD FOOTBALL STARS ARE ALSO  
GRADUATING AS ACADEMIC STARS

USD football stars Stephen Connolly and Greg Stein, graduating on Sunday, are not your typical jocks, according to Toreros football coach Brian Fogerty.

"So often you get the dumb jock image with college football players, but these guys are prime examples of the kind of person we try to produce in our athletic program," Fogerty said.

Defensive back Stein, named defensive player of the year for 1985 and two years ago, is graduating with a 3.4 grade point average. He paid for part of his USD education with a scholarship from the National Football Foundation Hall of Fame.

Connolly, an offensive lineman selected the team's most valuable player in 1984 and this year's team captain, is graduating with a 2.9 GPA.

Both are graduating in four years time, an uncommon feat for many college athletes, Fogerty said.

Connolly, a San Diego resident, is receiving a bachelor's

degree in a business administration, and Stein, from  
Huntington Beach, is receiving a bachelor's in economics.
