ERNEST HAHN TO HEADLINE USD ALUMNI SUMMIT

Developer Ernest Hahn will headline a panel of presenters at "USD Alumni: Inspiring Excellence," the third annual Alumni Summit at the University of San Diego, on Saturday, February 16.

Hahn, chairman of the USD Board of Trustees, will focus on his experiences working with USD student volunteers in a presentation on "Inspiring Leadership." Dr. Author Hughes, now in his 20th year as USD president, will forecast what the university will be like in 25 years in a talk on "USD: Vision for the Future."

Other speakers at the summit will include Dean Thomas F. Burke, Vice President for Student Affairs; Dr. James Burns, Dean of the School of Business; and Fran Oldak Dolan, recipient of the 1990 Bishop Buddy Distinguished Alumnus Award.

Michael Liuzzi, partner with the legal firm of Barnhorst, Bonar, Incorvaia & Glancy and president of the USD National Alumni Association, will deliver opening remarks. Lori Murray Simpson of Lori Murray & Associates, president-elect of the National Alumni Association, will close the summit with a "Call to Action."

John Trifiletti, USD Director of Alumni Relations, said close to 200 alumni are expected at the summit, a record

attendance. "Our yearly alumni summit is a kind of stockholders' meeting for USD," Trifiletti said. "It's an opportunity for graduates who have a personal investment in this University to be briefed on what's going at USD and on where USD is headed."
