### FOUR TRUSTEES HONORED AT BLACK TIE AFFAIR

Four members of the University of San Diego Board of Trustees were awarded the status of "trustee emeritus" at the Friday, Jan. 19, President's Club Dinner.

The dinner-dance, hosted annually by USD President Author E. Hughes and his wife, Marge, was attended by an estimated 235 friends and supporters of the University.

The Most Rev. Leo T. Maher, bishop of the San Diego Catholic Diocese and chairman of the USD board, announced after dinner that the following trustees had been elevated to the ranks of emeritus are:

\* Dee Baugh, wife of Dr. Wilson Baugh and a member of the USD board since 1976.

\* Margaret Duflock, also on the board since 1976 and a 1963 graduate of the San Diego College for Women, which later merged with the College for Men to become USD.

\* Charles M. Grace, a trustee since 1972. He is a retired Los Angeles area businessman.

\* Leland S. Prussia, a trustee since 1977. He is formerly chairman of BankAmerica Corporation.

As trustee emeriti, Bishop Maher said, "these distinguished men and women will have the opportunity to continue to have a leadership role in university affairs.

"Trustee emeriti will have standing invitations to attend board proceedings and, if they wish, act as advisors. And we hope our trustee emeriti will continue to grace us with their presence at wonderful special events such as this one."

The black tie affair was held on campus in the University Center.

The crowd danced to the big band sounds of Steven Spencer Music (cq) and were entertained during dinner by the All American Boys Chorus.
