SAN DIEGO, Calif.--The new edition of the San Diego Law Review, published in January, is dedicated to the memory of Brigadier William J. Miller.

Miller was the School of Law's first "dollar-a-year" faculty member. A member of the English Bar, Miller taught the history of common law. In recognition of his outstanding contribution, Miller was awarded an honorary L.L.B. in 1962.

Miller was commissioned in the British Royal Signals and served in Gallipoli, Iraq and Palestine in World War I. Following colonial service, he administered various districts in Palestine. He was admitted to the Inner Temple in London in 1925. During World War II he served various positions, including Chief of Staff for Civil Affairs under Field Marshall Montgomery. He retired from the service in 1945 and later became a resident of the San Diego area.
