MCCOSKER PHOTOGRAPHS EXHIBITED AT USD MAR. 9

The photography of Duncan McCosker, professor of photography on the faculty of the University of San Diego, will be exhibited at USD's Founders Gallery beginning March 9 and running through March 26.

Founders Gallery is open to the public from noon to 5:00 p.m. weekdays, Wednesdays until 9:00 p.m.

Entitled "Bathers," the exhibition will focus on images of figures at the beach. "Such a dreamy landscape," McCosker says, "acts as a foil to the realistically described bathers walking along the sand near the water's edge. The photographs suspend the figures with notation to their special differences, and regards them with a peculiar kind of grace." Most of the photographs were made using a  $2\frac{1}{4} \times 3\frac{1}{4}$  camera and are, McCosker believes, unusual in that they approach large format print quality while retaining the possibilities of instantaneous photography.

The artist, whose works are in the permanent collections of Yale University, the Bibliotheque Nationale in Paris, and the Museum of Modern Art, New York, will be present to open the exhibition at a reception on March 8, from 7:00-9:00 p.m.
