\$40,000 GRANT TO TRAIN STUDENTS TO TEACH SEVERELY HANDICAPPED

For the third straight year, the University of San Diego's School of Education has received a \$40,000 federal grant to train students to teach the severely handicapped.

Acquisition of the grant enables the school to hire a permanent director for the program, Jan Writer, a specialist in training teachers to work with handicapped children and adults.

Writer has headed up the program the past two years.

Before coming to USD, Writer was an assistant professor at the University of Arizona and an adjunct instructor at the University of Texas.
